

ORDINANCE 1213

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND, TEXAS, EXTENDING THE DECLARATION OF DISASTER ISSUED BY MAYORAL PROCLAMATION ON MARCH 13, 2020 IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Carolyn McWaters, Mayor Pro-Tem of the City of Cleveland, Texas, acting as the Mayor due to the vacancy created in his position, issued a Mayoral Proclamation declaring a state of disaster for the City of Cleveland to alleviate the suffering of people and to prevent the spread of COVID-19 throughout the City of Cleveland; and

WHEREAS, the conditions necessitating such disaster declaration continue to exist; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to prevent the spread of COVID-19 throughout the City; and


WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 418.108(b), Texas Government Code, a local state disaster may not be continued for a period in excess of seven (7) days without the consent of the governmental body of the political subdivision;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND, TEXAS:

Section 1. The declaration disaster, which was signed and executed by the Mayor on March 13, 2020, and continues to be effective through March 20, 2020, shall hereby be renewed and extended an additional sixty (60) days through May 20, 2020, as authorized by Section 418.018 of the Texas Government Code.
